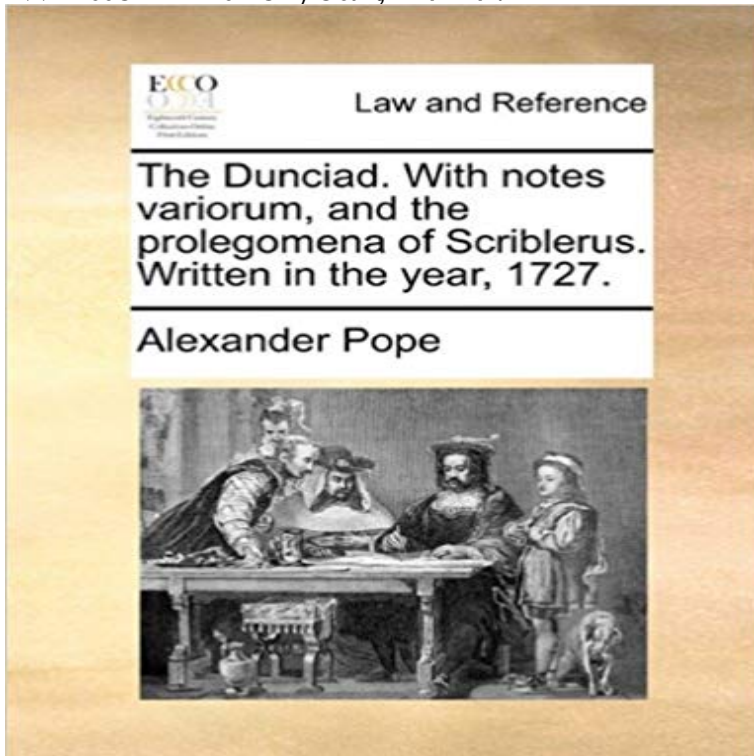


The Dunciad. With notes variorum, and the prolegomena of Scriblerus. Written in the year, 1727.
